



Recent news

Report on 45ACC

The 45th Australasian Combinatorics Conference was hosted at The University of Western Australia (Perth), in the week 11-15 December 2023. There were 77 participants, from all over the world: the Phillipines, Germany, USA, Netherlands, New Zealand, Japan, Croatia, Ireland, Canada, Singapore, Thailand, Belgium, and Australia.



There were 9 invited speakers:

- Sara Davies (The University of Queensland) The Hamilton decomposition problem
- Gary Greaves (Nanyang Technological University) How to design a graph with three eigenvalues
- Krystal Guo (University of Amsterdam) Algebraic graph theory and quantum walks Nina Kamčev (University of Zagreb) Common and Sidorenko linear patterns
- André Kündgen (California State University San Marcos) The Saturation Spectrum of odd cycles
- Padraig Ó Catháin (Dublin City University) Quadratic forms in design theory
- Tadraig O Carrell (Bullin (Bu for algebraic objects
- Gabriel Verret (University of Auckland) Local actions and eigenspaces of vertex-transitive graphs

We also had 56 contributed talks, including 19 student talks eligible for the Anne Penfold Street Prize. The prize went to Dorde Mitrović (University of Auckland) for his talk Automorphism of direct products of circulant graphs. The photo shows Binzhou Xia presenting the award to Dorde.



The inaugural CMSA Prize was awarded to Nina Kamčev (University of Zagreb). This prize was recently constituted by CMSA Council to be awarded at CMSA annual conferences to early career researchers for their outstanding research contribution to any area of combinatorics. The conference excursion was a trip to the port city of Fremantle, and a tour of the old Fremantle Gaol, which was built in the 1850s. There were also informal trips to the beach and to all the great things Perth has to offer. The conference dinner was held at UniClub on the UWA campus.

An Outreach Opportunity

Maths Challenge is a unique open style annual problem-solving program designed to support and encourage mathematically gifted students from years 3 to 10 and their teachers. It is produced by the Australian Mathematics Trust and has been running for 33 years. There are over 15000 entries in a typical year. The problems and teacher guides are prepared by a committee of up to 16 committed volunteer teachers, educationalists, and mathematicians. University of Auckland

In December 2023 Marston Conder was awarded the New Zealand Mathematical Society's Kalman Prize for Best Paper. This prize is awarded for 'an outstanding and innovative piece of research in the mathematical sciences published by a member or members of the NZMS' in the previous five years, namely the paper *Edgetransitive bi-Cayley graphs*, co-authored with Jin-Xin Zhou, Yan-Quan Feng and Mi-Mi Zhang (Beijing Jiaotong University), and published in the Journal of Combinatorial Theory, Series B 145 (2020) 264–306.

University of NSW Sydney

Zhi Yee Chng, from the School of Mathematics and Statistics, has recently been awarded a PhD for his thesis titled *On the Ramsey results of tree graphs versus generalised wheel graphs*.
