The Fifteenth Australasian Conference on Combinatorial Mathematics and Combinatorial Computing will be held at the University of Queensland, Brisbane, Queensland, during the week 10-14 July 1989. All interested persons are cordially invited to attend, and contributed papers are welcome in all areas of combinatorics and combinatorial computing, pure and applied. Invited speakers include C. C. Lindner (Auburn), B. D. McKay (A.N.U.), R. C. Mullin (Waterloo), A. Rosa (McMaster), D. R. Stinson (Manitoba), R. Tamassia (Illinois), C. Thomassen (Tech.U.Denmark) and N. Wormald (Auckland).

At least one half-day session will be devoted to combinatorial algorithms. If you have software you are willing to demonstrate at the conference, please get in touch with Dr Peter Eades, Dept of Computer Science, Univ. of Queensland, St Lucia, Qld 4067, and let him know what computing facilities you will used.

The conference registration fee is A\$65 (members), A\$75 (non-members).

The conference proceedings will be published by Ars Combinatoria, subject to the usual arrangements for refereeing.

Accommodation is available in Cromwell College, on the University of Queensland campus, at \$34 per day for bed and breakfast.

Registration will start on the evening of Sunday, 9th July, in Cronwell College; wine and cheese will be served. There will be a cocktail party on Monday, 10th July, and a film evening at Schonell Theatre on Tuesday, 11th July, followed by cake and coffee in the Staff Club.

The conference excursion, on the afternoon of Wednesday, 12th July, will be a boat trip on the Brisbane River from the University of Queensland to Newstead House and the Gateway Bridge, and will include lunch on board and a tour of Newstead House. This will cost no more than \$20; bring all your friends and it will work out to much less.

The conference dinner will be held on the Thursday evening and will take the form of a barbecue, for which we have booked the covered patio at the back of the Staff Club, overlooking the University Lake. If the weather is uncomfortably cold (possible, but not very likely), we'll have access to the Members' Bar. The cost will be \$10, for nuts and chips before dinner, four salads, steak or vegetarian mushroom parcels, coffee and chocolate mints. Drinks and desserts will be available in addition. The Annual General Meeting of CMSA will be held before the dinner.

The registration form (second circular) is enclosed. Please register early if you are coming, to give us an accurate indication of the numbers who plan to attend the conference; to give a talk and to stay in Cromwell College.

The third circular will be sent in April. Deadline for abstracts is 10th June.

COMBINATORIAL MATHEMATICS SOCIETY of CHINA

The Combinatorial Mathematics Society of China (CMSC) was formed in 1988.

CMSC has set up a new organisation, the International Advisory Centre of Information and Material of Combinatorics (IACIMC), to gather papers and books on combinatorics, and to serve combinatorialists everywhere. All materials on combinatorics will be welcome.

CMSC and the Hefei Branch of Academia Sinica are jointly organising an International Conference on Combinatorial Mathematics (ICCM), to be held in Hefei during the period 13th-18th July, 1990. (This date is still tentative.) The sessions at the conference will cover a wide range of combinatorial topics, including combinatorial designs, coding theory, combinatorial group theory, combinatorial matrix theory, combinatorial set theory, enumeration, finite geometries, graphs, hypergraphs and networks, magic squares, combinatorial identities, combinatorial optimisation, difference sets, combinatorial algorithms, matroids, Ramsey theory, history of combinatorics and applications.
