A.I'. Street (Director) declared the meeling open at 5.06 p.m., with 35 people present.

1. Apologies.
D.A. Ilolton, B.D. Jenes, C.II.U. Jitule, J.IR. Seleerry.
2. Minutes of the A.G.M. 1088.

Minutes of the previons Amual (Eenemal Meeting (Camberra, 17 May 1988) were circulated. It was moted that the venue of the 1988 A.G.M. should be spelt Haydon-Allen Buikling, and the abbereviation for the Australian Mathematical Society should be Aus.M.S., becanse the abbreviation A.M.S. Ias always referred to the older American Mathematical Sociely. ('There were six such occurrences in the 1988 Minutes, and one such oceurrence in the Treasurer's Pinancial statentent.)

MOVED: That the minutes be adopted with these allerations.

## 3. Business nrising from the Minutes.

It was meted that the $\Lambda$ istralian Mathematical Suricty has been oflicially int formed of the decision mot to alfiliate the C.M.S.A. with the Australian Mathenatical Socicty.

## 4. Director's Report.

I'lic Director thanked various people and orpanisations for their contributions to the conference and to speakers' expenses; these included: Ralph Stanton; the Vice Chancellor of The Universily of Qucensland; the Commonwealth Bank al St Lucia, The Universily of Queensland; the Mathenatics Department at 'The University of Queenslaud; the Computer Science Department at 'The University of Qucensland; the Schoul of Mathematics, the leaculty of Science and the linently of furommation Technology all at Quensland University of 'lechmology; ERA COM Pi.y. Led.; the Mathematical Sciences Rescarch Centre at A.N.U.; the Australian Defence Porse Acalcmy.

Details about submission of papers for the Proceedings of the 1989 comference were elarilied.
'I'lee Director reported that the red serics of Ars Combinatoria is to be produced from The University of Qucerstand (Department of Mathematics). Oflice space will be made available, and there was some discussion concerning necessary funds to support the production of the series. 'lhe possibility of the ('.M.S.A. providing some support was considered, and the following modion was put:

MOVFD: 'Ihat the question of some linancial support for the "red" Ars Combinatoria from ilic U.M.S.A. be left to the current (1939) and next (1990) commitlees
of the Society.

The possibility of having two separate posilions in the Society for C.M.S.A. Director and Couference Urganiser was suggested. After some discussion il was decided that this might require a change to the constitution, so the following motion was pul to the meeting:

'Ihe 'Ircasurer's repert was moted, and was aceepled with minor amendments (MOVED: ALSI'ACII/BHEACH carried nem. con.)

## O. Booklet Editor's Report.

The booklet editor reported that there liad been no response as yet with offers for this series. He pointed out that the two schools of thought, that the series would consist or (a) undergraduate level mini-lexts, or (b) school or undergraduate level problems, perhaps sinilar lo Math Ulympiad type questions, were not contradictory, and that both types of booklet would be welcome. An appropriate cover coulf indicate which series a booklet belonged to. He also requested that booklets should be reasonably self-contained, and not rely on excessive references to other matcrial.

7. The Sixteenth conference.

The sixteentlo conference is to be held at Massey University, New Zealand, from 3rd to 7th December 1090. The Director read a letter from Charles little to the meeting. MOVED: 'That Reger Duke continue as the Society's Treasurer.

8. Venues for conferences in 1001 mal 1002.

The seventeenth conference, in 1991, is to be hifd all the: Ausiralian Deffice Force Academy, University Cullege, University of N.S.W., in Canberra. (NEUMANN/SDANTON carried nem. con.) A suggestion was made that perliaps this canference cond be later in the year than July, since the sixtecnth conference is lo lee in December 1990.

The eighteenth conference will be in Perth in 1992, jeint organisers being al the Universily of Western Australia and Curlin University of Jechnology. (HIEACII/BMLIINGTON carricd nem. ram.)

## 0. Incrense in C.M.S.A. subscriplion.

It was decided to increase the C.M.S.A. ammal sulscription from \$5 to \$10 AusAralian. 'Ehree reasons for this were (i) to help cover increased postage costs, (ii) Io help cover conference costs, since we canot expect the donalions we have received this year to be part of a continuing pattern, and (iii) to allow for the possibillity of helping with the costs of production of the red series of Ars Combinatoria (see iten 4 above). It was also suggested that the term of ('.M.S.A. membership shomid run from conference to conference rather than for a calendar year.

## 11. General IBusiness.

MOVED: That the C.M.A.A. congratalates l'eter O'llalloran on his contributions to mathematics in Australia throngh his work in the Anstralian Mathematics competitions, and congratulates him and his co-organisers on the conduct of the 1088 Intermational Mathematical Olympiad.


The final motion of the mecting concerned the 80th birthday of Professor Bernhard Nemman. The proposer was Sheila Willians:
"Many of us at the 1989 ACCMCC [elt that we could not let the occasion pass withont noting that October $15 h_{1}$ this year marks yel another milestone in the life of an eminent member of the C.M.S.A. I refer, of conrse, to Bernhard Nemmann, who has atlended these conlerences regularly and has encouraged the activities of the G.M.S.A., not to mention the distinction he (and Manna) bronght to Austratian mathenaties. Althongh not myself a studeat of Bernhard, I [eel 1 lave cluse acadennic connections with him as my doctoral thesis gave a partial answer to a question lie had raised (and bull my husbands were researbl shadents of his). As someone whe has known Bernhard and his family for half my life (if not hall his!) it gives me particular pleasure to propose the motion:
'Ihat this meeting ofler Professor Bernhard Neumann heartiest congratulations on the occasion of lis eightieth birthday.

I call upon Cheryl to second this mution and to present Bernhard witlo a promise of a stmall gift from the Suciety."
'I'he seconder was Cheryl Pracger:
"It gives me great pleasure to second Sheila's motion of congratulations to Bernhatd Neuman for his eightiet.ln birthday in October this year.
