THE AUSTRALASIAN JOURNAL OF COMBINATORICS

The Australasian Journal of Combinatorics is a new journal devoted to the publication of research concerning all aspects of combinatorics, pure and applied. It is intended that at least two volumes of the journal will appear each year. Intending contributors should submit two copies of manuscripts to the Editor-in-Chief (A. P. Street), the Managing Editor (A. J. Rahilly) or any one of the Associate Editors (E. J. Billington, D. M. Donovan, J. N. Holt or S. Oates-Williams), all of whom are at the Editorial Office of the Australasian Journal of Combinatorics, Department of Mathematics, The University of Queensland, 4072, Queensland, Australia. The journal is produced using a photooffset process. Because of this it is most important that authors submit manuscripts typed so as to occupy a 6 inch \times 9 inch (152mm \times 229mm) rectangular area centred on each page. Authors are also urged to submit papers the tille page of which exhibits the following order: title, author/s, abstract, followed immediately by the body of the paper.

SECOND CIRCULAR

The Sixteenth Australasian Conference on Combinatorial Mathematics and Combinatorial Computing will be held at Massey University, Palmerston North, New Zealand, during December 3-7, 1990.

PROGRAMME

The following people have agreed to deliver one-hour invited lectures:

Fan Chung, Bell Communications Research; Charles Colbourn, Department of Computer Science, University of Waterloo; Ron Graham, AT&T Bell Laboratories; Jennifer Seberry, Department of Computer Science, Australian Defence Force Academy; Ralph Stanton, Department of Computer Science, University of Manitoba; Doug Stinson, Department of Computer Science, University of Manitoba; Douglas Woodall, Department of Mathematics, University of Nottingham.

There will also be half-hour contributed papers. The response to the first circular (at least 57 contributed papers) suggests that parallel sessions will be necessary. It is planned to begin the formal sessions at 8.45am on Monday, December 3 and to conclude at approximately 5.00pm on Friday, December 7. The Annual General Meeting is planned for the evening of Tuesday, December 4, and there will be a four-course conference dinner at the Staff Club on the evening of Thursday, December 6. The cost of the dinner will be \$25 per head, including GST ($12\frac{1}{2}\%$ Goods and Services Tax). Drinks are extra.

An excursion to the National Wildlife Centre at Mt. Bruce is planned for the afternoon of Wednesday December 5. Many of New Zealand's rare birds are bred and displayed here, including the takehe, once believed to be extinct. This visit will be followed by a barbecue, and a trip through the scenic Manawatu Gorge. The estimated cost of the excursion will be \$25.

TRAVEL

Palmerston North is serviced by Air New Zealand (Domestic), Ansett New Zealand, and several regional airlines (such as Eagle Air and Air Nelson), with connections from each of the international gateways of Auckland, Christchurch and Wellington. All airlines offer "Thrifty" fares, giving a 35% discount for advanced ticket purchase; these fares do not attract GST if booked overseas. Sample Thrifty fares are:

Wellington - Palmerston North	\$NZ 66

All services from North America use Auckland, and this is usually the most convenient arrival point from Australia.

There is no scheduled bus service from Palmerston North airport to the city or to the campus, but taxis and rental cars are available at the airport. If you wish to be met at the airport, please give appropriate details on the attached registration form.

Palmerston North is also served by trains and intercity buses. If you wish to be met at the railway station, please give the time of arrival on the registration form. If you wish to be met at the bus terminal, you will also need to indicate whether you are travelling with Newman's Coach Lines or the NZR Road Services.

If you are arriving by car, the most convenient car parks are the shaded areas near the numbers 12 and 41 on the campus map. Parking is also available on the ring road.

ACCOMMODATION

Rooms have been reserved in Egmont Court, one of the student hostels on the campus of Massey University (number 4 on the enclosed map). Rates (inclusive of GST) are NZ \$38.70 per night for bed and breakfast. If you wish to book accommodation in Egmont Court, please send a \$20 deposit with your registration form. Only single rooms are available in the hostel.

For those preferring hotel or motel accommodation off-campus, the following table gives a representative sample of those on or near the bus route from central Palmerston North to Massey and should be booked directly via the fax number indicated. (The country code is 64, and the area code is 63.) The quoted nightly rates are for 1-2 persons, inclusive of GST, in \$NZ. (As of July 1990, \$1NZ = \$0.75(AUS), \$0.69(CDN), \$0.59(US)).

ABSTRACTS

If you plan to give a talk, please send an abstract on A4 paper by October 31, if you have not already done so. Abstracts should be double-spaced, with a 2cm margin all round. The title should be centred at the top of the page, followed by the author's name (centred) and affiliation (centred).

PROCEEDINGS

The proceedings of the conference will be published in the Australasian Journal of Combinatorics. The cost of your copy of the proceedings is included in the registration fee. If you wish to have your paper published in the proceedings, please submit it to one of the organisers at the conference. All papers submitted will be refereed.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Although the conference is being held during a relatively warm month, occasional imperfections in the weather may be experienced. Participants are therefore encouraged to bring warm and rainproof clothing. The normal maximum and minimum temperatures for December are 21°C and 12°C.

The power supply is 240V at 50Hz.

REGISTRATION

In the first circular you were asked to indicate whether you were likely to attend the conference. You are now asked to return the attached form, stating definitely that you will attend this conference, and whether you will contribute a paper. The registration fee is \$NZ160, with a reduction to \$140 if it is paid by September 30. These figures are reduced to \$150 and \$130 respectively for CMSA members. For full-time students the fee is reduced to \$70.

There will be an opportunity to register at an informal social gathering at the Staff Club from 6pm until 9pm on Sunday, December 2. A further opportunity to register will be provided from 8.00am onwards in the foyer of the Agriculture and Horticulture Lecture Theatre Block (number 31 on the map), the building in which all the lectures will be held.

The organisers would be very grateful for the return of the registration form with the registration fee (and deposit for hostel accommodation) as soon as possible.
