Venue

The 18th ACCMCC will take place in Perth, Australia, on a campus which is located in a picturesque setting on the edge of the Swan River and adjacent to Kings Park, a large natural bush reserve. The University is noted for its interesting architecture and attractive gardens and, being only 6 km from Perth's city centre, is easily accessible by bus.

A full day on Tuesday will be spent at Curtin University of Technology which is some distance south of the Swan River (transport will be provided).

Contributed Papers

Participants are invited to present papers of 25 min duration on any area of combinatorics or its connection with computer science: such papers may discuss recent work or be expository in nature. An abstract covering at most one A4 page (including title and author's name) should be supplied no later than **18 May 1992**; it will be reproduced as submitted. Any paper which passes a standard refereeing process will be published in the Australasian Journal of Combinatorics if the author so desires. In this event, papers should conform with the journal's format: namely, typed within a 6 inch by 9 inch (152mm by 229mm) rectangular area centred on each page, with the title page exhibiting title, author/s, affiliations, and abstract, followed *immediately* by the body of the paper.

Social Activities

An informal get-together for all participants and their guests will be held in conjunction with registration late on Sunday afternoon. There will be a cocktail party on Monday evening: this will enable participants to mingle with mathematicians attending two other conferences being held at UWA alongside the 18th ACCMCC. The sight-seeing excursion on Wednesday afternoon will be a boat-trip to Fremantle, a coastal town near Perth with an interesting colonial history: this will include lunch and drinks on board as well as a short tour of Fremantle's main attractions. The conference dinner will be on Wednesday evening: it will be a smorgasbord in Currie Hall, followed by a brief exhibition of Indian classical dance; there will be ample opportunity before and after dinner to chat over drinks in a fireside setting.

On the Saturday after the conference, information will be available for those interested in taking a day trip to Rottnest Island (15 km off the WA coast) which is the home of diminutive kangaroos called 'quokkas'. Its attractions also include swimming (in Winter?!), fishing and cycling, as well as sampling the delights of the famous Rotto Bakery!!

Travel and Transport

Australian Airlines has been appointed the official airline for the conference in return for valuable and much appreciated contributions made to the Organising Committee. It is important therefore that you support this appointment by flying Australian Airlines wherever air travel in Australia is required.

Transport from Perth Airport to the University will be the responsibility of participants: a regular bus service will transfer you from the Airport to the city hotels, but not Currie Hall, at a cost of about AUD\$6; the taxi fare to UWA is about AUD\$20.

Accommodation

Single accommodation has been arranged at Currie Hall, a co-educational student residence opposite the University. Some of this accommodation may be available before and after the conference. The rate will be \$36 per day per person for bed and breakfast (lunch and dinner will be paid for separately).

For people interested in motel or self-catering accommodation, we list a few suggestions with brief details. There are many other possibilities but they tend to be more expensive or less accessible from the University. Each of the following is situated between the campus and the city, and only a few minutes away from either via a direct bus route. They are opposite attractive parkland and provide comfortable (but not luxurious) accommodation; all prices are 'room only' and variable. Participants should make their own arrangements directly with the motels, or through Australian Airlines when booking their airfare. There is a large shopping centre, and a wide range of cafés and restaurants, near the University.

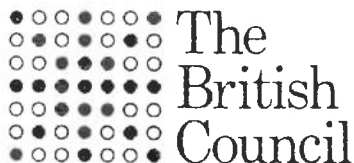

Discrete Mathematics Booklets

The Society plans to produce a series of booklets on Discrete Mathematics. The first three are being processed and are entitled:

- * Induction, Inclusion-Exclusion, and the Pigeonhole Principle
- * Combinatorial Aspects of Block Designs
- * Maximal Flow in a Network

You are invited to submit additional 30 - 50 page manuscripts that are self-contained and well-motivated: each should focus on one topic in discrete mathematics, and provide enough examples and problems to give the reader a sound understanding of the material. Booklets aimed at undergraduates could be useful as a supplement to lectures; while those at the postgraduate level could be a topic review, an example catalogue, a problem collection, or an annotated bibliography. The Australasian Journal of Combinatorics

This is a relatively new journal devoted to the publication of research concerning all aspects of combinatorics, pure and applied. It is intended that at least two volumes will appear each year. Contributors should submit two copies of their manuscripts to the Editor-in-Chief (A P Street), or any one of the Associate Editors (E J Billington, D M Donovan, J N Holt or S Oates-Williams), all of whom are located at the *Department of Mathematics, The University of Queensland, St Lucia, Australia, 4072*. The journal is produced using a photo-offset process, and so it is most important that authors submit manuscripts typed within a 6 inch by 9 inch (152mm by 229mm) rectangular area centred on each page. Authors should also ensure the title page of their papers exhibit the following order: title, author/s, affiliations, abstract, followed *immediately* by the body of the paper.

The cost is AUD\$30 per volume plus postage: to obtain more information about the journal, and to arrange a subscription, please contact the Editors at the address noted above.

**MINUTES* of the Annual General Meeting
held on 11 July, 1991
at the Seventeenth Australasian Conference on
Combinatorial Mathematics and Combinatorial Computing
at the Australian National University
Canberra, Australia**

J Seberry (Director) declared the meeting open at 4.00 pm.

1. Minutes of the 1990 AGM:

Minutes of the previous AGM (Massey University, Palmerston North, NZ, 4 December 1990) were circulated.

MOVED: That the minutes be accepted.
(SEBERRY/McAVANEY, carried nem. con.)

2. Financial Statement:

The financial statement was presented and some minor amendments noted. It was remarked that the statement should refer to the sixteenth conference, not the twelfth.

MOVED: That the financial statement be accepted with these amendments.
(STREET/BREACH, carried nem. con.)

3. Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's Report was distributed and considered.

MOVED: That the Treasurer's Report be accepted.
(STREET/PRAEGER, carried nem. con.)

4. Journal Report:

A Street requested that papers be submitted as soon as possible to the Journal and noted this can be done by email in either LaTeX or AMSTeX format. Information regarding the Journal was circulated and increases in subscriptions noted; the cost to libraries will rise in 1993. The Journal is AUD\$846 in the red. The subscription drive is continuing and all members are urged to subscribe and/or arrange for their institutes to subscribe to the Journal: at present, there are only 19 regular subscribers.

MOVED: That a vote of thanks be passed to the editorial board of the Journal for its efforts.
(SEBERRY/CACCETTA, carried nem. con.)

5. Booklet Editor's Report:

K McAvaney reported that Booklet 1 is ready for printing, and Booklet 2 is being refereed. There was extensive discussion on the cost of publishing the booklets and D Holten's offer of his successful books. The cost of printing 500 of the society's booklets is \$400, whereas to publish all fifteen of D Holten's books would cost \$6000 (500 of each) and the society does not have that amount of money. The discussion then centred around how marketable the society's booklets would be, the possible revenue they would generate, and alternative avenues of publication.

MOVED: That alternatives be investigated and action taken at the discretion of the Executive Committee and K McAvaney, with a ceiling of \$1000 for costs.
(McAVANEY/CACCETTA, carried nem. con.)

6. **First Notice of Motion - Conference Fees:**

There was extensive discussion about the budget and the registration fees for the conferences as well as about the cost of a subscription to the Journal.

MOVED: That the conference fee include the cost of the conference proceedings.
(DAWSON/GIBBONS)

AMENDMENT: "... and the monies collected (as part of the registration by the Conference Director for the production of the proceedings of the conference) be transferred to the account of the Australasian Journal of Combinatorics and those funds be applied by the Editor (of the Journal) on behalf of the members from whom these funds were collected".
(PALMER/BOSWELL)

The amended motion was then put and carried.

7. **Second Notice of Motion - Life Membership:**

It was suggested that there be a category of life membership, that life membership should be 12 times the society's annual subscription, but that nobody can take out life membership until L Caccetta's foreshadowed motion for the next AGM is decided.

MOVED: That life membership should be 12 times the annual subscription.
(SEBERRY/McAVANEY)

AMENDMENT: "... but does not include a subscription to the Journal".
(McKAY/RINSMA-MELCHAT)

The amended motion was then put and carried (three votes against).

8. **General Business:**

(a) **Future Conferences:**

These will be held in Perth 1992 and Waikato 1994, and Adelaide offered to hold a CMSA conference in July or September 1993. Adelaide's proposal for a week adjacent to the AusMS Meeting in July 1993 was accepted with thanks.

(b) **Subscriptions:**

MOVED: That subscriptions be set at AUD\$10 for 1992.
(SEBERRY/CACCETTA, carried)

(c) **Membership of CMSA:**

H Gustafson announced that membership could be checked via email. B McKay agreed to investigate the creation of an emailing group within CMSA for the transmission of Newsletters and other information.
