by July 16th 1984 to ensure inclusion in the programme. (We cannot guarantee that late contributions will be accepted.)

The proceedings of XII ACCMC will be published as Volume 19A of Ars Combinatoria. All papers will be refereed. Contributors may submit their manuscripts in final form at the conference, or, failing this, should send the final form of their manuscript by September 30th 1984 to -

The Editor, Ars Combinatoria, Department of Computer Science, University of Manitoba, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada R3T 2N2. Typing Instructions For Manuscripts:

- (a) The text on the paper should be spaced with a spacing of 14.
- (b) Typing should be done on standard A4 paper (or on American 84 × 11 paper).
- (c) The typing on each page should be restricted to a box 15 centimetres by 224 centimetres. (It is important that the typist should not extend the pages beyond the proper length and it is also important that lines should not stretch out beyond the indicated length.)
- (d) This box should be placed on the page so that there is a margin of 24 centimetres to the left of the page. The margins at the top and bottom of the page should be even. (Typists may find it convenient to rule out a black box on one sheet of paper and put this behind the page that they are currently typing.)
- (iii) As well as those already mentioned, several other people have already indicated an interest in attending including Tony Gardiner, M.K. Siu, R.G. Stanton, Douglas Rogers.

#### (iv) Accommodation

Accommodation has been reserved for the conference at Currie Hall, a University Hall of Residence adjacent to the campus. Most of the rooms are single study bedrooms but a few double rooms are available, and it is possible to accommodate children. Participants may stay in Currie Hall before the conference, but must vacate their rooms by 10 am Friday, August 17th (due to the return of students for the start of 3rd term).

The cost of accommodation at Currie Hall will be A\$21 per day for bed and breakfast; lunches and dinners are available at a cost of A\$4 per meal. For children aged 5-15 years half-rates apply, and for children less than 5, accommodation is free. Lunches may also be taken at University House, (the academic staff club), and there are several other restaurants close to the campus. The Conference Dinner will take place at Currie Hall on Thursday evening at a cost of A\$18.50 per person.

Accommodation during the conference has been arranged on a dinner-bed breakfast basis. Thus the overall rate (including the Conference Dinner) from Sunday evening August 12th after dinner through to Friday morning August 17th after breakfast will be A\$135.50 per person. A deposit of A\$25 per person is required by July 1st 1984. (This deposit will be refundable up to July 1st, but is nonrefundable after this date.) If it would be more convenient for (overseas) participants the entire accommodation cost may be remitted by July 1st 1984.

\* The rules have changed. The typing must be done on special paper which will be sent to you on request once we have a quantity of it, or at worst will be distributed at the conference. Information about alternative forms of accommodation (for example hotel, motel) may be obtained from Dr P. Schultz, Secretary CMSA, Department of Nathematics, University of Western Australia, Nedlands 6009, Australia.

Please let us know if you have any special requirements, for example a special diet, or disability, or if you require special arrangements for children.

It may be possible to arrange care for preschool children at Unicare, a child care centre adjacent to the campus, if sufficient notice is given. If other care is required we will try to help.

# (v) Registration

Registration fees are payable at the conference (but may - be sent ahead of time) and will be -

A\$45 for members of the Combinatorial Mathematics Society of Australasia (CMSA).

A\$50 for non-members (giving membership for the rest of the year).

A\$22.50 for students and unemployed persons (including retired persons).

#### (vi) Social Programme

On Sunday evening there will be a wine and cheese party in Currie Hall from 8 pm onwards at which participants may register.

On Monday early evening the Vice Chancellor of the University of Western Australia, Professor R. Street, will welcome conference participants at a reception.

The conference excursion is planned for Wednesday afternoon. It will be a cruise on the Swan River including a three course lunch. Conference participants may bring quests. The cost will be A\$24 per person.

The Annual Dinner will be held at Currie Hall on Thursday evening. The cost of the dinner is included in the charge for Currie Hall residents. The cost to non-residents will be A\$18.50. Conference participants may bring guests.

For the duration of the conference, participants will be members of University House, the academic staff club.

### 2. Subscription renewal

Members are reminded that the 1984 subscriptions for the Combinatorial Mathematics Society of Australasia fall due on January 1st. The rates are A\$4 for those in full-time employment and A\$2 otherwise. Prompt payment would be appreciated.
