R. B. Eggleton, Rectilinear Drawings of Graphs.

Drawings of finite graphs in the euclidean plane are rectilinear if each edge is a straight line segment. This paper is concerned with the problem of determining which equivalence classes of planar drawings of a finite graph include rectilinear drawings. Several relevant theorems are proved, and the paper concludes with a conjectured solution to the general problem, in terms of a finite set of forbidden subdrawings.

#### (III) Accommodation

Accommodation has been reserved at Knox College, University of Otago. This university hall of residence is some ten minutes walk from the department of mathematics and statistics. The journey between the two is a delightful one passing through the beautiful woodland setting of the Botanic Gardens with occasional glimpses of the gurgling and picturesque Water of Leith.

The cost of accommodation for this ldyllic setting should be A\$150/day but we have been able to negotiate a price for dinner, bed and breakfast (no lunch unless requested) for not A\$100/day, nor would you believe A\$50/day but around N.Z.\$35/day. (An exact price will be available in a later circular.)

For those wishing hotel/motel accommodation there are a variety of these residences in the neighbourhood for approximately N.Z \$40/day, bed only.
